How the activity will be carried out This activity is best introduced after the children have had some time to explore minibeasts. Ask the children to choose a plastic minibeast. What kind of minibeast have they got? Explain to the children that they are going to make a house for their minibeast. Support them as they choose a box - is it a good size? What do minibeasts like to live in? Do they like it to be bright or dark? Dry or Damp? Soft or prickly? Help the children to choose the natural resources to make a comfortable home for their minibeast. Talk about where minibeasts like to hide so that they feel safe and secure. Questions to ask/Language to use House, home, comfortable, safe, secure, happy, tiny, tucked away, soft			
Differentiation (Birth to Three) Use a large tray to make a minibeast home as a group. Fill it with compost, wood chippings, stones etc. Add plants and plastic minibeasts, and let the children explore this minibeast world together. Evaluation	Extension Children could go to the outside space and collect the natural materials themselves to make the bug houses. As they do so, they can think about what a minibeast needs in the place where it lives.
